


YOUTH PARTICIPATION — A Guiding Principle in All Our Actions



JUSTICE STARTS WITH US - YOUTH AMBASSADORS IN ACTION

In recent years, through the program "Justice Starts with Us", we have been redefining the way children and young people — whether they experience justice as victims or witnesses of violence, or as individuals in conflict with the law — come into contact with the system.

We create spaces where their voices guide change, where their rights are recognized and protected, and where their perspective is not defined by their experience, but by their ability to participate actively and contribute to a fairer and more humane justice system.

The formation of the cluster was supported by the **Unit for Integration and Support of Unaccompanied Minors of the Ministry of Migration and Asylum** and the **Ministry of Justice**, both of which **embraced the initiative** by **referring children and young people involved in justice processes**.

This initiative creates a platform for young people with lived experience of injustice to express their views, share their realities, and advocate for fairer, more child-friendly systems. Their journey — with meaningful exchanges in Greece, and across Europe — amplify their voices and highlight the challenges children and youth face when seeking protection, accountability, and justice.





Young people come together in **safe and inclusive spaces**, where they **can connect with peers**, **share experiences**, **and build a sense of trust and belonging**. Through guided sessions **on non-violent communication**, **public speaking**, **and child rights**, they strengthen their confidence, collaboration, and leadership skills.

These experiences help them better understand justice systems, express their perspectives with clarity, and engage meaningfully via restorative circles and inter-generational dialogues with decision-makers and key stakeholders turning knowledge into empowerment and participation into change.

Through "Justice Starts with Us," children and young people are not only learning about justice — they are redefining it, using their experiences, creativity, and courage to inspire a system that truly listens to them.

Art, Theatre & Music – Voices of Expression and Change

Art - and particularly theatre and music - serves as the vehicle through which children and young people express themselves, release their emotions, and discover new ways of communication and participation.

This year, the theatre workshops are implemented in collaboration with the theatrical director Aikaterini Papageorgiou, as part of an artistic process that bridges creation and social awareness. Young people who have come into contact with the justice system as minors transform into Justice Transformers, presenting an original theatrical intervention that reflects their own experiences and voices — a powerful act of expression, reconciliation, and hope.

Through movement, improvisation, and dialogue, participants explore themes of justice, identity, and belonging; they transform their lived experiences into art, and art into a voice of strength and truth. These creative spaces nurture empathy, collaboration, and resilience, offering a safe environment for connection and expression, where creativity becomes a means of understanding rather than a reopening of wounds.

Music and visual arts further enrich this process, opening channels of communication that bridge differences and bring people closer together through rhythm, color, and emotion.

Through performances and exhibitions, children and young people take on an active role as storytellers, agents of change, and ambassadors of a justice that is more participatory and truly child-friendly.



Youth Led Restorative Circle of sharing



A Restorative Circle of sharing marked the International Day of Refugees (June 2025)

Led by our Youth, the circle brought together young people and community members, including representatives from the municipality and local organisations,

Through art, poetry, and dialogue, participants shared their journeys, hopes, and sense of belonging.

The gathering culminated in the creation of our "Tree of Community" — a living symbol of solidarity, connection, and shared humanity.

Together, they created a shared space for dialogue, empathy, and connection, where youth voices reminded everyone of the power of visibility, dignity, and inclusion.

"I want to remind you that I'm a human being like all of you, and I need equal opportunities," one of our young participant shared!

A message that echoed through the circle and called us all to more humanity and community connection.
